Know that Guy Fawkes went to war in Europe to fight on behalf of Spain, which was a Catholic country. He called himself 'Guido' instead of Guy and became an officer. When he came back to England, he became involved in a plot to kill King James I. A group of men, led by Robert Catesby, wanted Guy Fawkes to be involved partly because he understood how to use gunpowder, which is very explosive and dangerous. This was their Gunpowder Plot. Know that in 1605 in London a group of young Catholic men met to talk about their worries and how angry they were that King James I is punishing Catholic people in England. Know that the men often met in secret in London. Know that the men often met in secret in London. Know that they decided to blow up the Houses of Parliament every year and that he would be there in November 1605 Know that Thomas Percy, who was a royal bodyguard, moved to a house not far from Parliament and the men started digging a tunnel from the house to underneath the Houses of Parliament. They dug at night to avoid anyone hearing them. Know that Thomas Percy was allowed to rent a space in a cellar directly underneath the Houses of Parliament, right under where the King would be sitting! So they didn't need to dig a tunnel anymore Know that Guy Fawkes pretended to be Percy's servant and started moving barrels of gunpowder into the cellar and hid them. Altogether

•	Know that the King's guards knew that he was lying and so the King agreed that he should be tortured until he told
	the truth about who else was involved

- Know that he was tortured for two days until he revealed his real name, and the next day he said the names of 5 other people that were involved. However, those two days gave the other plotters time to run away.
- Know that Guy Fawkes was executed
- Know that the King sent out a **Proclamation** to ask everybody to search for Thomas Percy who had ran away
- Know that Soldiers eventually found Thomas Percy at Holbeche House in Staffordshire on 8th November 1605. He was hiding with some of the other plotters, including the leader Robert Catesby. In the battle that followed, both Thomas Percy and Robert Catesby were killed. The other plotters were captured.
- Know that the King decided that on the 5th November every year, from that day, we would remember the Gunpowder Plot and how Guy Fawkes's plan failed
- Know that every year we burn bonfires and put a model of Guy Fawkes on top. We light **fireworks** and **sparklers** and celebrate the failure of the Gunpowder Plot. This is called **Bonfire Night**
