# Introduction

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event.

# Aims and Objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- Is practical and smart;
- Identifies the children with the school;
- Prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;
- Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents;
- Is designed with health and safety in mind.

# School Uniform

School uniform must be worn by all pupils from FS2 up to Year 6. The wearing of school uniform is optional in FS1. All items of clothing should be named.

### <u>Boys</u>

School or plain royal blue sweatshirt White or pale blue polo shirt or shirt Trousers/Shorts - grey or black Black shoes

# <u>Girls</u>

School sweatshirt or a royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan. White or pale blue blouse/polo shirt Skirt/pinafore dress or trousers –grey or black Blue and white checked or striped dress Black shoes

### **Footwear**

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels and flip-flops, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. Footwear should be black shoes or trainers.



For outdoor PE they will need trainers or sandshoes. Any children without trainers/sandshoes will not be able to participate in the lesson. You will be informed of the day of your child's PE lesson via the half termly year group newsletter.

# <u>Jewellery</u>

On health and safety ground we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain and a small watch. We ask the children to either remove these objects during PE and games, or cover them with a tape, to prevent causing injury.

### <u>Hair</u>

The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. We strongly encourage those with long hair to tie it up for school.

### <u>Makeup</u>

The school does not permit children to wear makeup including nail polish or false nails.

This policy will be reviewed every two years.
