The River Thames is the longest river in England and flows through London.</li> <li>Know that Ben Nevis is the highest mountain in the UK.</li> <li>Know that the highest mountain in Wales is Mount Snowden.</li> <li>Know that the surrounding seas to the UK are the North Sea, the English Channel, the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean</li> <li>Know the difference between weather and climate.</li> <li>Know that the UK has 4 seasons – Autumn (September to November), Winter (December to February), Spring (March to May) and Summer (June to August) and what these are generally like.</li> <li>Know that the seasons are caused because of the earth tilting on its journey around the sun - when the earth is leaning towards the sun it is summer and 6 months later when it leans away it is winter.</li> <li>Know that the temperature changes and is how hot or cold it is.</li> <li>Observe daily weather around the school and comment on patterns identified.</li> </ul>
