This area included the entire Yucatán Peninsula and all of the territory now incorporated into the modern countries of Guatemala and Belize, as well as the western portions of Honduras and El Salvador• Know about the Spanish conquistadors and their expeditions in Mesoamerica• Use sources to look at Mayan temple ruins and generate questions that the conquistadors might have asked• Find out about how the Mayans civilisation developed over time.• Know what an archaeologist does• Look at how artefacts can help us find out about the Mayan civilisation.• Know about the city states of the Mayans and how society was organised• Compare how our society is run and who makes our decisions to how Mayan society was structured.• Know about different groups of Mayan people from kings and nobles to slaves and farmers• Know how Mayans lived in various independent city states• Know how and why the Mayan civilisation came to an end
