As readers we will be:

Using our knowledge of predicting, questioning, summarising and clarifying to help us when continuing to read and understand *The Hundred Mile An Hour Dog* by Jeremy Strong.



As writers we will be:

Focusing on *The Great Kapok Tree* in English. We will first be writing a non-chronological report all about our chosen rainforest. Then we will write a persuasive piece, persuading people to not chop trees down. We will then have the opportunity to re write the story in the style of a play-script. Then the children will have fun learning all about using effective language in a piece of poetry.

In French we will be:

Continuing to listen to *The Little Red Riding Hood*. The children will learn how to read and say certain key words from the story in French.

As mathematicians we will be:

We will be using our maths mastery knowledge to learn all about angles, perimeter of a shape and lines of shapes. We will also be recapping knowledge learnt over the summer term.



In Geography we will:

Focusing on how Hull Docks have changed over time. We will go on a trip around the City Centre to use field work to be able to answer the following questions. What is a dock? How did Hull's docks change over time? Why do you think some of the docks changed overtime?
