## <u>English</u>

#### Remember, if you get stuck it is okay to ask for help!

Remember our sentence system.

Pencil down. Paper in front of us.

A sentence starts in out head - so think about what you want to say.

Say it.....say it again and check it makes sense.

Say it again and count the words.

Pick up your pencil and write it down.

Read it back and check it makes sense.

I have had to start a new diary because I have written and doodled in it that much. How is yours looking? If you have not started to write one, it is not too late to start. You do not have to write lots and lots – a sentence or two is better than nothing, and you can make it all up if you like.

What weird and wonderful things can you come up with to write about?

Don't forget to doodle in it as well, I know how you all like drawing.

### Example:

Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> June.

On my bike to school I had a race with a magpie. We raced all the way there and I went as fast as I could. It felt like I was going as fast as a speeding rocket! I lost though.

#### Friday 19th June.

My pet squirrel followed me to school. She has started playing in the tree outside of our classroom and pulls silly faces at me when I am trying to teach. What a rotter.

Take a look at this picture and think about questions you have about it. Practice your sentence skills by writing the questions down – think about what you need at the

end.



Just like we do in class, think about the following:

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We are looking at **instructions** again this week. Remember, instructions tell us what to do. Play a quick game of 'Simon Says...' to get used to giving instructions.

Can you put these instructions in the correct order?







(History)

Oh no....l've made a right mess of the timeline of William Wilberforce's life! Can you put these in the correct order by looking at the dates and show where they would go on the timeline - you might need a grown up to help you. February 1807 He tries again to stop slavery and is successful - but not for 26th July 1833 all slaves. He is successful and gets slavery stopped across all 29th July 1833 William Wilberforce dies of the British Empire. aged 73 in London - 6 days after abolishing slavery. 7th April 1784 Whilst at University he is elected to become a Member March 1796 of Parliament. He tries for the first time to get slavery abolished - but 29th August 1759 it does not happen. William Wilberforce is born in Hull. Could you make a play acting out the life of William Wilberforce?
